What is Student-Generated Assessment?

- Student-generated assessment is assessment that is created by the students in an effort to enhance their learning and increase instructor awareness of that learning.

Why Student-Generated Assessment?

- Students' metacognitive awareness
- Student motivation
- Accurate assignments
- Level of knowledge acquisition

Examples of Student-Generated Assessment

- Rubrics

Content	meaning & purpose	Achieves goal of presentation; presentation follows an effective plan that enhances material	Achieves goal; follows clear plan that elucidates main idea; adequate to assignment	Approaches goal; planning is apparent but at times may be ineffective; may fall short of assignment	Fails to meet goal; thesis unclear; little or no sign of planning; may be fail to meet assignment
	preparation	Well-rehearsed, very familiar with material, expert in presentation	Knows material well	Generally handles material competently, but audience not confident of expertise	Lacks preparation; may lose place; may leave awkward silences

Bloom's Taxonomy

- Knowledge- Simple recall and recognition
- Comprehension- Understand meaning
- Application- Use the information
- Analysis- Organization of parts
- Synthesis- Use old parts to create new ideas
- Evaluation- Make judgments and compare ideas
