Dr. Goodall is currently the co-investigator in the Consortium for Strategic Communication (CSC) on a \$2.6 million grant from the Office of Naval Research entitled, "Identifying Terrorist Narratives and Counter-Narratives: Embedding Story Analysts in Expeditionary Units." His talk draws from the work that he has done on this grant project. Housed in the Hugh Downs School of Human Communication, The CSC is an interdisciplinary organization that explores the intersection of communication with issues of national security, terrorism and counterterrorism, and public diplomacy.
