Program: Complete the English major and required Education courses during four years in the College of Liberal Arts. Although you will remain declared as an English major in the College of Liberal Arts, apply to the Secondary Education program in the College of Education at the end of your sophomore year. This requires a minimum of 60 credits (junior status), a 2.5 GPA, the Pre-Professional Skills Test (PPST) or the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST), EDU 202 and either CEP 330b or EDU 214. The PPST or CBEST should be taken near the end of your sophomore year, and the NTE during the same semester as CTL 450. Your ninth semester is spent in the College of Education practicing teaching.
