



Immunizations Required for UNR Classes

EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY:

Section 1. NAC 441A.755 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 9 or unless excused because of religious belief or medical condition, a person shall not attend a university until he submits to the university proof of immunity to tetanus, diphtheria, measles, mumps, rubella and any other disease specified by the State Board of Health.

Section 1. NAC 441A.755 9. Any student who is enrolled in a program of distance education and who does not attend a class on campus is exempt from the requirements of this section. [“On campus” is defined by the university as all of Washoe County.]

Thus, ALL students who wish to enroll in UNR courses that meet in Washoe County, including those offered through Extended Studies, MUST submit a copy of official documentation for two doses (one month apart) of measles, mumps, rubella (MMR) and a diphtheria/tetanus (DT) within the last ten years. If you were born prior to 1957, you only need to provide documentation of the DT shot.

Missing documentation = No registration, no grade, & no credit. No exceptions.

UNR’s Orvis Nursing Clinic Can Help!

The Orvis Nursing Clinic (ONC) can provide low-cost immunizations at convenient times during the week and on selected Saturdays. Shots available include:

MMR (a two shot series, one month apart): \$16 each;

MMR series plus DT: \$20 for first MMR and a DT, plus \$16 for second MMR;

DT only: \$16

Other immunizations are available—call the ONC at 327-5000 for more information.

PAYMENT ARRANGEMENTS: The ONC only accepts cash and local checks.

No credit or debit cards. No insurance billing is available.

The Orvis Nursing Clinic is connected to the State of Nevada Web IZ program. If you have previously received shots at the county clinic, it may be possible to access those records and print the documentation.
