## Justice Management Courses open to ALL UNR Graduate Students\*

12 week, 3-credit, *online* courses Aug 29, 2011 to Nov 19, 2011

- JM 601 Introduction to Justice Management, 3 credits.** Subject matter experts engage students in examining the fundamental issues associated with the Justice Management program's areas of concentration: Juvenile, Adult, and Executive Court/Agency Administration.
- JM 690B Sp Top: Supervision & Staff Development, 3 credits.** Managerial practice and managed care approaches to supervision; service efficiency; accountability; effective interaction with staff, clients, administrators, and the community.
- JM 690C Sp Top: Caseflow / Court Administration, 3 credits.** Court administration; caseflow management, funding, transactions, human resources, judicial services, information technology, education and training, and legislation.
- JM 704 Judicial Process II (Criminal law & procedure), 3 credits.** Overview of criminal law and procedure. Diverse view points of major issues in management of criminal matters. Processing cases from arraignment to parole.
- JM 705 Juvenile and Family Law and Procedure, 3 credits.** Examination of current issues and concerns in Juvenile and Family Law and procedures; improving court practice in child abuse and neglect cases.
- JM 723 Early Intervention and Crime Prevention Programs, 3 credits.** This course will examine effective strategies for intervention with young offenders and the role of juvenile justice in crime prevention.
- JM 734 Mental Health Issues in Justice Management, 3 credits.** Examination of selected issues confronting the criminal justice system today including criminalization of the mentally ill, diagnosis and screening, forced psychotropic medication, re-entry, etc.
- JM 735 Special Topics in Homeland Security: Threat Groups, 3 credits.** Explore the historical, current and future impact of national and international threat groups to homeland security
- JM 792 Sp Top: Substance Abuse in Criminal Justice, 3 credits.** This course is a study of the inter-relationship between substance abuse or dependency and offender behavior. It will also examine the impact of drug use on the criminal justice system and society.
