Selected Master of Justice Management Courses open to UNR Graduate Students*

- JM 601 Introduction to Justice Management, 3 credits.** Subject matter experts engage students in examining the fundamental issues associated with the Justice Management program's areas of concentration: Juvenile, Adult, and Executive Court/Agency Administration.
- JM 736 Special Topics in Homeland Security: Impact on Jurisprudence, 3 credits.** Impact of security threats on national and international law. Bases in American and International law for powers invoked by the U.S. since 9/11 to execute its "global war on terror." Evolution of federal legislation, statutes, presidential policy, and court rulings; changes in policy and law underpinning homeland security.
- JM 792 Special Topics: Community Prosecution, 3 credits.** Community oriented approach to crime prevention and law enforcement. Fundamentals of community prosecution, problem solving, forming partnerships, and creating a community prosecution initiative. Public policy regarding social, constitutional, and institutional concerns for community prosecution strategies.
- JM 791 Special Topic: Juvenile Sex Offenders, 3 credits.** Overview of sexual offender treatment as it impacts the adolescent and youthful offender. Impact of Adam Walsh Act on practitioners. Selected issues such as criminalization, risk diagnosis and screening, reentry concerns, trauma issues, mental health concerns, long term effects of abuse, program design, implementation and evaluation, registration, notification, risk of recidivism, and transition to young adulthood.
- JM 705 Juvenile and Family Law and Procedure, 3 credits.** Current issues and concerns in Juvenile and Family Law and procedures. Development of law and procedures regarding juvenile status offenders, child abuse and neglect, and domestic violence; relation to police departments, child protective agencies, and probation departments.
- JM 703 Judicial Process I (Civil law & procedure), 3 credits.** Comprehensive overview of civil law and procedure. Areas of law covered in context of causes of action filed in court. Litigation, discovery, trial.
