Prof. Frost joined the chemistry department at UNR in July 2002. He received his B.S. in 1995 from Elizabethtown College, a small liberal arts college in central PA and his Ph.D. in 1999 from Texas A&M University. Prior to his move to Nevada Dr. Frost was a postdoctoral research associate at Columbia University. Since joining the faculty at UNR, he has worked with eighteen undergraduate students, nine of whom have published peer-reviewed papers on water-soluble phosphine ligands and catalysis. In 2007, Frost received a prestigious NSF CAREER award. He also serves as Co-PI for an NSF funded REU site at UNR. Let us all congratulate Dr. Frost for his achievements.
