




MESSAGE FROM THE FOUNDING AND INAUGURAL DIRECTOR



GLOBAL STUDIES RESEARCH

The Ozmen Institute strives to become a hub for globally and internationally-oriented research across disciplines and united with the expressed desire to provide researchbased solutions to the important society problems we confront in the twenty-first century. In 2019, the Institute's second operating year, it formally took over the administration of the faculty and graduate student international research grants on campus. In this first year, the Institute awarded more than \$25,000 in funding across 12 grants, a 22% increase over the prior year when it had been administered centrally. In the subsequent year, the Institute awarded more than \$35,000 in funding across 17 grants, an additional 38% increase. Faculty and student recipients represent 18 different departments across eight academic units on campus, underscoring the campus-wide reach of the research program.

GLOBAL STUDIES RESEARCH

Just as we were launching the outreach mission of the new Ozmen Institute for Global Studies, the COVID-19 pandemic closed down our world. This felt significantly ironic. After all, a main goal of the Institute is to reach out to the world about topics of global significance, but suddenly we were faced with having to shut our doors to the wider world we were excited to engage. Fortunately, irony quickly turned into opportunity as we realized that contemporary technologies (especially virtual webinars) would actually enable us to reach a much larger audience over 600 people total—than we had initially imagined. What originally looked to be a fallow year of outreach actually turned into a rich year of public engagement around some major issues of our time: the coronavirus pandemic, environmental justice, and the use of digital spaces in international contexts by LGBTQ+ individuals. The Institute also co-sponsored the International Women's Entrepreneurship Symposium, an online conference, in March 2021 that drew over 500 attendees from around the world.

The stage has now been set for advancing the vision of the Institute to serve as a catalyst for public dialogue and outreach that broadens our understanding of global issues impacting local, regional, national, and international communities.



GLOBAL ENGAGEMENT AWARD

The Global Engagement Award, a university-wide award of the Ozmen Institute for Global Studies, recognizes full-time academic or administrative faculty for their outstanding contributions to international programs, international program development, academic and global research programs, or international research and outreach at the University of Nevada, Reno. In 2020 the Ozmen Institute increased the monetary value of this award to \$3,000 to underscore the value of international engagement to our campus and elevate the prominence of this award.

Chris Morgan, Frazier-Fowler Endowed Chair in Prehistoric Great Basin Archaeology; Associate Professor of Anthropology



Chris Morgan has more than 15 years of research, education, and outreach in international settings. His research focuses on the evolution of increasingly intensive economies and sociocultural complexity among worldwide huntergatherers around the

world including China, Mongolia, and Argentina. In addition to research, Morgan has trained international and U.S. students in archaeological field and laboratory analytical techniques and mentored student research projects.

FACULTY SPOTLIGHT: EUGENE PARK

Eugene Park, Rick and Cathy Trachok Endowed Chair in International Studies

The establishment of the Ozmen Institute for Global Studies had immediate domino effects on other investments in global engagement at the University of Nevada, Reno. Not long after the Ozmen Institute was launched, a second substantial financial commitment to establish the Rick and Cathy Trachok Endowed Chair in International Studies was received, which expects the Chair

to have a formal role with the Institute. This gift led to the hiring of Dr. Eugene Park, a preeminent Korean Studies scholar who joined the Department of History in fall of 2020. Together, these generous investments provided a strong foundation on which the University of Nevada, Reno can continue to grow its international engagement and reputation. Below is a brief biography for Dr. Park.

Eugene Y. (Gene) Park is a historian of East Asia, especially Korean politics and society since the 14th century. After studying at UCLA and Harvard, Park completed postdoc with the Council on East Asian Studies at Yale (2000) and has held faculty appointments at the University of



California, Irvine (2000–09), the University of Pennsylvania (2009–20), where he served as director of the James Joo-Jin Kim Program in Korean Studies (2010–19) and the University of Nevada, Reno (since 2020). Park has also taught at Harvard, Korea University, McGill, Seoul National University and Yonsei University, as well as giving some 60 invited lectures, speeches, or presentations, including the 26th Annual Stanley Spector Memorial Lecture on East Asian History and Civilization at Washington University

in St. Louis (2019). Author of four books, he is currently pursuing several projects, including a translation, Kim Ingeol, Politics of Public Opinion in Korea: Local Councils and People's Assemblies, 1567–1894. Besides history, Park maintains interest in genealogy, haplogroup genetics, physical anthropology, portraiture and religious studies. He has served as a consultant to Who Do You Think You Are? (Wall-to-Wall Productions/George IV Productions), Finding Your Roots with Henry Louis Gates, Jr. (PBS) and Ancestry.com. In 2016 Park co-chaired the organizing committee of the Eighth Biennial World Congress of Korean Studies.



MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

In July 2021 Dr. Sudeep Chandra was named Director of the Ozmen Institute for Global Studies. He will succeed founding Director Dr. Berch Berberoglu and will serve a three-year term.

The Ozmen Institute for Global Studies is one of the key programmatic initiatives supporting the global focus of the University's mission, "to provide outstanding learning, discovery, and engagement programs that serve the economic, social, environmental

and cultural needs of the citizens of Nevada, the nation, and the world." With this mission as our central focus, the University prepares students for "global citizenship" with the goal of developing them into "confident leaders for the state, national and global community" with a vision of serving "as a catalyst for the betterment of our society" (NSHE 2014). Our Institute's vision enhances an already strong scholarly enterprise at the University of Nevada, Reno. The University has a long history of engaging in globally relevant topics in areas such as health, the economy, the environment, politics, race relations, gender, social inequality, anthropology, and engineering innovations to name handfuls of disciplinary areas. As the University has increased its Carnegie Ranking and expands its footprint as a top-tier University, we are poised to bring a broad breath of knowledge and expertise from various fields to understand global topics, move towards solving issues, and create a knowledge base which can guide humanity. To accomplish these endeavors, we need to support our faculty, students, and staff that have the energy, enthusiasm, and knowledge that will make contributions to our larger society.

The faculty and students are the backbone of any University institution. Encouraging broad and directed participation in the Institute's mission by faculty and students ensures the longevity and development of creative activities by the Institute. Thanks to our founding Director, Dr. Berch Berberoglu, we have well over 100 faculty affiliated with the Institute. Through this direction and with healthy participation from our advisory



committees the Ozmen Institute for Global Studies has made significant movement towards supporting globally relevant activities and experiences for our students and faculty along with sponsoring informative and engaging events for our local citizenry.

My vision for the Institute is to build on our past achievements and enhance the learning, education, and problem solving conducted by our University personnel while creating scholarly opportunities

that could not be undertaken by a single expert. We are interlinked, and so we need to envision a world where knowledge is shared readily, experiences are gained by many, and cross disciplinary activities are supported to elevate society for the common good. To implement this vision, I will build on the efforts of our founding Director and our colleagues to a) bring a focused organizational structure to the Institute which provides an opportunity for faculty and students to participate, b) develop additional resources for scholarly activities which address the world's pressing challenges and knowledge gaps, c) coordinate with our University partners to develop a more informed local citizenry that can learn and benefit from our University knowledge bank, and d) celebrate the efforts of faculty and their students by sharing our collective story, connections, and possibilities that will make us a resilient society. Simply at the end of three years, I envision a stronger Institute with increased capacity to support the needs of faculty, students, and our society. I look forward to collaborating with you to achieve our common successes and movements towards a more peaceful and harmonious global society. We have many possibilities in front of us to do so.
