Dear Ms. Noel Nightingale,

Pursuant to Section 5 of the Resolution Agreement entered into by the U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights (OCR) and the University of Nevada, Reno, the University committed to report on progress towards the completion of the Corrective Action Plan according to the approved schedule. This letter serves as our second such report.

The report is organized similarly to our first progress report submitted and approved by OCR in October of 2018. As previously communicated in the first progress report, activities and tasks with requirements listed as completed may not be included in this report, as well as future reports, to more clearly highlight our progress.

Additionally, the University is happy to announce that Phase 1 of the new University website went live on February 20th, 2019. Although much work has gone into making the launch possible, the sheer complexity, scope, and total time required to migrate content belonging to colleges, divisions, and major units into the new version of our central content management system is taking longer than anticipated.

Therefore, the University would like to request a 5-month (from 6/30/2019 to 12/1/2019) extension on the planned completion date for activities and tasks listed in Section 2, Table 5 of the Corrective Action Plan Schedule (Website Accessibility – Content Management System Web Content (www.unr.edu)). The extension will give colleges, divisions, major units, programs, centers, and labs as well as the Marketing & Communications Web Team, the additional time necessary to facilitate a multi-phased rollout of the site and ensure that we migrate as much content as possible into new University website where all users can benefit from a more accessible site that makes accessibility, usability, and consistency its top priorities. With 250+ website sections to migrate, the extension will also help us minimize disruptions to University operations, recruitment and enrollment. Additionally, it would provide a single compliance date (12/1/2019) that is in line with what has been communicated to site owners, content creators and University Administration.

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Summary

In the past 6 months, the University has completed a number of the activities and tasks listed in the approved Corrective Action Plan Schedule (see Section 4 below). Key activities and tasks that have been completed are:

- Host the 1st Annual Campus Accessibility Forum
 - The Information and Communications Technology Committee hosted the 1st Annual Campus Accessibility Forum on Wednesday, Nov. 28, from 4-5:30 p.m. in the Joe Crowley Student Union Theater. The committee presented a summary of actions and continuing efforts with online accessibility. A summary of the external audit was presented, as well as an overview of the University's work toward software, web and instructional content accessibility. There was a question-and-answer session at the end of the presentations. A captioned video of the event is available on the <u>accessibility</u> <u>section of the University website</u>. More information regarding this task can be found in the completed requirements Section 1.1.2 and the ongoing requirements Section 3.1.2 below.
- By January 1, 2019, captioning all videos professionally or internally produced, used in courses and shared on campus websites or on video storage sites
 - To ensure that all videos shared on campus websites or video storage sites are captioned, Marketing & Communications has compiled an inventory of all embedded and linked to videos across the sites currently tracked in Siteimprove. As of March 2, 2019, Siteimprove has identified 4,065 total videos. Of the 4,065 videos identified, 1,907 videos are embedded using either the YouTube, Vimeo, Wistia, or Kaltura video players. Web Accessibility Liaisons have access to a report within Siteimprove that can help them determine which videos need to be removed or remediated.
 - For those videos on video storage sites published using the official University account, Marketing & Communications has taken steps to ensure that all videos are captioned. As of March 5, 2019, the MarCom team has identified 67 captioned videos out of a total of 67 videos in the main YouTube account (100% captioned). The MarCom team also identified 6 videos in the main Vimeo account. Of those 6 videos, 6 (100%) are captioned.
 - Additionally, Teaching and Learning Technologies (TLT) is working to ensure that all instructional videos are captioned. TLT has captioned over 1630 videos and 417 hours of video. Since the last report submitted to OCR, TLT has captioned over 410 videos and 90 hours. University Policy has required all new instructional video content to be captioned since January 1, 2018. We continue to make progress on existing content, while keeping up with new content. Existing video content is captioned according to prioritization where, the most used content in the courses with the highest enrollments are done first. Procedures are in place where students can request any uncaptioned content they encounter to be captioned. TLT provides both in-house and professional captioning services for faculty. TLT also supports faculty in the creation of accessible instructional video content.
- On February 20, launch Phase 1 of the new University website
 - The Office of Marketing & Communications, in collaboration with the Office of Information & Technology and Marketing & Communication Specialists from various major units, launched Phase 1 of the <u>new University website</u> which included improvements to the overall accessibility and usability of the University's flagship website. Phase 1 included new and improved versions of the home and top-level pages (such as about, academics, admissions, etc.) as well as top-level pages for three

additional major units (Division of Research & Innovation, College of Engineering, and College of Liberal Arts). For a full listing of the launch phases for the new University website, see Addendum Section 2.0 – New University Website Launch Phases.

 Additionally, before launching Phase 1 of the new University website, the Marketing & Communications Web Team conducted manual user testing of portions of the new University website with a visually-impaired software tester who is employed through the University's Disability Resource Center. The software tester was presented with 7 use cases which were structured to be as similar as possible to the 7 that were originally tested during the external audit. During the testing, the visually-impaired software tester discovered several issues and provided recommendations to address the barriers she experienced. These recommendations have since been implemented and were included before the Phase 1 launch of the new University website.

The University continues to make progress on the activities and tasks listed in the Corrective Action Plan Schedule as in-progress. Key activities and tasks that are in-progress are:

- By December 1, 2019* (formerly said June 30, 2019), removing content from the site that will not be carried forward into the new design
 - The University has taken the approach to rebuild all content and infrastructure related to the central Content Management System. The University Website Redesign rollout started on February 20th. New WCAG 2.0 Level A and AA compliant content will continue to be published over the coming months in accordance with the New Website Launch Phases (see Addendum Section 2.0). As new content is created within the new CMS, old content will be removed. All content is tested for compliance in a staging environment. When content passes accessibility testing, it is then migrated to our production environment.
 - Additionally, the Office of Marketing & Communications has implemented a new process for PDFs within the new CMS. All new PDFs are first scanned using Siteimprove. Once the scan is complete and the PDF passes, it can then be moved to a production environment.
- By December 1, 2019* (formerly said June 30, 2019), removing documents and CMS-based embedded multimedia that will not be carried forward to the new University website
 - The MarCom team utilized Siteimprove to develop an inventory of documents and media outside of the CMS. As of March 2, 2019, Siteimprove has identified 38,765 linked documents: 33,790 PDF files, 425 Excel files, 2,850 Word files, 1,718 PowerPoint files. Of those 33,790 linked PDFs identified, Siteimprove has flagged 17,918 (53%) of the linked PDFs as inaccessible as of March 2, 2019. Activities and tasks related to removal and remediation of inaccessible documents are listed below (see Section 2.2.2. In-Progress Requirements related to Table 5: Content Management System).
 - The Marketing & Communications team also utilized Siteimprove to develop an inventory of all CMS-based embedded videos. As of March 2, 2019, Siteimprove has identified 271 videos that are embedded using either the YouTube (155), Vimeo (120), Wistia (0), or Kaltura (0) video players. Some pages have multiple embeds. Web Accessibility Liaisons have access to a report within Siteimprove that can help them determine which videos need to be removed or remediated. Activities and tasks related to removal and remediation of inaccessible embedded multimedia within the CMS are listed below (see Section 2.2.2. In-Progress Requirements related to Table 5: Content Management System).

Lastly, the University continues to implement ongoing efforts to improve accessibility awareness and communication across campus. Key activities and tasks that are ongoing are:

- Maintain* web property (URL) registry of all known University domains and subdomains (*formerly said Identify and develop)
 - The official web registry is maintained by the Information & Communication Technology (ICT) Audit subcommittee and represents, to the best of our knowledge, all known domains and subdomains. To verify accessibility compliance, websites on the registry, that can be added and tracked by Siteimprove, are added to the University's instance of the Siteimprove Intelligence Platform. The number of websites tracked in Siteimprove decreased slightly between August of 2018 and February of 2019, from 190 domains to 183. This 4% decrease represents an effort to remove any domains that are no longer active.
 - Additionally, as of March 2, 2019, Siteimprove is tracking and analyzing approximately 80.56% of websites that are in the web property registry. The remaining 19.44% of websites are either not compatible with Siteimprove's platform, not reachable from offcampus, or are not publicly available. Efforts to monitor and verify the remaining sites are in-progress.

Campus-wide Efforts

Accessibility Training Plan

The University has developed a training plan to ensure the ICT Accessibility Policy is put into practice during the digital media creation process. The University provides regularly scheduled face-to-face training opportunities, synchronous, live online training sessions (by request) and has recently completed the online version of the training. The full listing of faculty and staff who have attended Basic Web Accessibility training can be found in Addendum Section 3.3. The training plan includes the following:

- All employees who create, edit or publish content to the web are required to attend Basic Web Accessibility Training on an annual basis. Other University personnel are welcome to attend Basic Web Accessibility Training.
- Faculty and staff who are currently part of the software procurement process were invited to attend Basic Web Accessibility Training (see Addendum Section 3.3 Training Attendees page 94 for a listing of those who attended) so that they understand the laws and standards related to web accessibility.
- The training provides best practices on how to make content accessible in accordance with our standards (WCAG 2.0 AA).
- Training is provided by a qualified presenter (see Addendum Section 3.2 General Accessibility Trainings Presenters Information).
- All training attendance is documented.
- Training reports are provided to the Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights (OCR) on an annual basis, until such time as the OCR closes its monitoring of our resolution agreement.

Monitor for Accessibility Compliance

Using the Siteimprove Intelligence Platform, the University is actively monitoring and reporting on the accessibility compliance of known domains and subdomains listed in the official web registry. All domains and subdomains are grouped by their respective college, division, or major unit. Each of the colleges, divisions, or major units that have received their Siteimprove Accessibility Report, which summarizes the accessibility compliance of each of their sites, is listed below (see Addendum – 1.0 Web Accessibility Liaisons)

Each college or division has designated a primary Web Accessibility Liaison who, per the <u>ICT Accessibility</u> <u>Procedures</u>, is responsible for:

- Being up to date on University policy and procedures related to accessibility
- Being knowledgeable on how to direct users on how to get the technical assistance they require
- Maintaining a registry of all websites within the college/division that are used for official academic or business activities
- Monitoring accessibility compliance of registry websites
- Reporting the registry to the ICT Accessibility Committee

The University continues to subscribe to a license to the Ally Canvas plugin which allows for the identification and reporting on accessibility compliance of instructional materials located in the LMS.

The ICT Committee continues to use an ad-hoc procedure for manually testing websites and web content.

Software Procurement

The University has developed and implemented a robust <u>Accessibility Procurement</u> process. All software being initially procured or renewed is being reviewed and validated for accessibility.

In the case of new software purchases, the process requires all software vendors to provide a Voluntary Product Accessibility Template (VPAT) if one has been completed, a commitment to remediate any barriers discovered in the software review and testing process, and a timeline for expected completion of remediation. In the cases of broad use, student-facing or public-facing software, the University also manually tests the software to verify the claims of accessibility (VPAT). Testing is performed by two processes:

- By a dedicated software tester who is blind and conducts testing by exploring the functionality of the software using the assistive technologies offered and supported by the University's Disability Resource Center
- By a certified software tester with the following certifications:
 - Digital Web Accessibility Program SiteImprove
 - Section 508 Trusted Tester. License number: 300937
 Certified by Department of Homeland Security.
 Office of Accessible Systems and Technology.
 - OFAC 056 Section 508 Compliance for Contracting Officer's Representative and Program and Project Managers (CPPM)
 Certified by Department of Homeland Security.
 Office of Accessible Systems and Technology.
 - Professional Web Accessibility Auditing Made Easy Certified by Ryerson University, Canada

In the cases of software renewals, letters are sent from the Vice Provost for IT & Chief Information Officer to the Supplier and the UNR Purchaser indicating that future renewal requests will not be approved unless and until the vendor or purchaser demonstrates the product meets software accessibility requirements for new software purchases.

Should software fail to meet software accessibility requirements an Equally Effective Alternative Access Plan (EEAAP) is submitted to the ICT Software Testing committee for review. If the ICT Software Testing committee approves of the EEAAP then the request is submitted to the Office of Information Technology for CIO approval for one calendar year, ensuring that any software purchase exception is reviewed annually.

Faculty and staff who are currently part of the software procurement process were invited to attend Basic Web Accessibility Training (see Addendum Section 3.3 – Training Attendees page 94 for a listing of those who attended) so that they understand the laws and standards related to web accessibility.

In the past 6 months, University Libraries created an inventory of all documents (PDFs, PowerPoints, Word docs, etc.) that are published online to identify those that need to be archived or carried forward into the new web design (changed to web pages, remediated, etc.).

This exercise allowed University Libraries to establish that it currently has 921 documents published online (reduced from 1351 in October 2018). Of those, 560 more may be archived or deleted. The bulk of the remaining 361 documents are minimally complex and will be easily remediated. University Libraries are in the process of hiring additional resources to help with the remediation process for these documents.

We believe this response constitutes full compliance with the completed requirement(s) listed above and defined in Section 3, Table 9 of the Corrective Action Plan Schedule.

Response:

The Research and Scholarly Works Subcommittee has, and continues to, meet regularly to address two areas: 1) language to post with online research and scholarly works content that does not meet current University accessibility guidelines, and 2) review of software and other methods of rendering problematic research and scholarly works content in an accessible format.

Since the last report, the subcommittee has developed language to be posted with online research content and scholarly works that is being remediated to meet accessibility guidelines. Two templates were developed and are now being made available to individuals and departments as needed. Those posting these notices have the option to include contact information specific to a department or unit.

Additionally, a particular focus of the subcommittee since the last report has been on making equations and formula accessible. This is a particularly problematic area for content. Two subcommittee members, Don Massie and Andrey Sarantsev, produced a white paper, Accessible Mathematics, that delineates the problems and suggests some current tools to address the problem. The paper is available as a resource to the University community and provides a roadmap for current and future work in this area. Some of the strategies outlined in the white paper have been published to the Accessibility section of the University website.

Lastly, the subcommittee is developing a list of the types of content considered research and scholarly works that the subcommittee will focus its efforts on concerning accessibility. These include, but are not limited to, research findings, graduate theses and dissertations, and gray literature. This is not a definitive list and is expected to be modified.

Over the past six months, the University has continued the process of remediating the issues identified in the 7 use cases and across the 40 "modules" (pages) that the auditor reviewed. The Marketing & Communication Web Team prioritized the modules with major issues identified in the report and has implemented fixes for 85% of the modules (11 out of 13) with major issues. Fixes to the modules included, but are not limited to, re-creating the page within the new University website template (home and admissions page), removing inaccessible content, and correcting the CSS outline attribute. The Marketing & Communications Web Team anticipates the remaining modules with major issues will be addressed within the next six months and reported on in the next progress report.

Additionally, before launching Phase 1 of the new University website, the Marketing & Communications Web Team conducted manual user testing of portions of the new University website with a visually-impaired software tester who is employed through the University's

Disability Resource Center. The software tester was presented with 7 use cases which were structured to be as similar as possible to the 7 that were originally tested during the external audit. During the testing, the visually-impaired software tester discovered several issues and provided recommendations to address the barriers she experienced. These recommendations have since been implemented and were included before the Phase 1 launch of the new University website.

2.0.2 - PeopleSoft In-Progress Requirement(s):

Over the past six months, the University has continued the process of remediating the issues identified across the 5 PDFs that the auditor reviewed. At of the time of this report, 2 out of the 5 inaccessible PDFs have been removed (40%). The Marketing & Communications team anticipates the remaining inaccessible PDFs will be addressed within the next six months and reported on in the next progress report.

Additionally, a site-license for Adobe Acrobat Pro was acquired during the Fall 2018 semester to assist faculty and staff in making their materials accessible. In December of 2018 the University also upgraded to an enterprise license for Formstack to provide a campus-wide forms solution that can offer more accessible online forms as replacements for fillable PDF forms used across campus.

For colleges, divisions, and major units outside the central Content Management System, the Marketing & Communications team continues to offer units the option of migrating their web content into the central Content Management System giving them an accessible template to work with. The Marketing & Communications team is continuing to help migrate 12,000 pages that currently reside on inaccessible web pages to accessible templates. Inaccessible websites and web content not migrating into the CMS, is being remediated by the college, division, or major unit to which it belongs. While site owners and content creators outside the central content management system remediate their current sites, the Marketing & Communications team continues to focus on the New University Website Redesign rollout and associated launch phases (see Addendum Section 2.0).

We believe this response represents progress towards fulfilling the requirement(s) listed above and defined in Section 2, Table 4 of the Corrective Action Plan Schedule.

Response:

The University has taken the approach to rebuild all content and infrastructure related to the central Content Management System. The University Website Redesign rollout started on February 20, 2019. New WCAG 2.0 Level A and AA compliant content will continue to be published over the coming months in accordance with the New Website Launch Phases (see Addendum Section 2.0). As new content is created within the new CMS, old content will be removed. All content is tested for compliance in a staging environment. When content passes accessibility testing, it is then migrated to our production environment.

Additionally, the Office of Marketing & Communications has implemented a new process for PDFs within the new CMS. All new PDFs are first scanned using Siteimprove. Once the scan is complete and the PDF passes, it can then be moved to a production environment.

We believe this response represents progress towards fulfilling the requirement(s) listed above and defined in Section 2, Table 5 of the Corrective Action Plan Schedule.

The goal of the report is to inform each college, division, or unit of the domains and subdomains with issues and provide a summary of the information that is available within Siteimprove. Web Accessibility Liaisons and domain owners are expected to use the information both in the report and in Siteimprove to inform their decisions regarding either remediating or removing inaccessible content by the planned completion dates listed in the Corrective Action Plan Schedule.

Additionally, access to and assistance with the University's instance of the Siteimprove Intelligence Platform is provided to Web Accessibility Liaisons, faculty, and staff by the

Marketing & Communications Web Team. Siteimprove users also have access to free online courses regarding basic web accessibility and using the Siteimprove platform through Siteimprove Academy.

Response:

In 2018, Marketing & Communications (MarCom) held 6 internal meetings regarding accessibility communications for the University's various audiences: campus, faculty, staff, students, and the community. So far in 2019, 3 additional meetings have been held to discuss accessibility related-communications. Additionally, members of the ICT Committee discussed accessibility and captioning at the University's Faculty Senate meetings 2 times during 2018 and 1 time so far in 2019. A campus-wide accessibility letter was delivered by the Provost in his Provost's Perspective on February 27, 2019. Dates for all the meetings mentioned above are listed in the Corrective Action Plan Schedule below.

The Information and Communications Technology Committee hosted the 1st Annual Campus Accessibility Forum on Wednesday, Nov. 28, from 4-5:30 p.m. in the Joe Crowley Student Union Theater. The committee presented a summary of actions and continuing efforts with online accessibility. A summary of the external audit was presented, as well as an overview of the University's work toward software, web and instructional content accessibility. There was a question-and-answer session at the end of the presentations. A captioned video of the event is available on the <u>accessibility section of the University website</u>.

Additionally, members of the ICT Committee were asked to be panelists at the November 20th Campus Conversation hosted by the University's Faculty Senate which focused on Website and Document Accessibility.

Lastly, members of the ICT Committee were asked to attend the Administrative Faculty Committee Brown Bag event on March 6th. Jim McKinney provided an update regarding reports to and requirements from the Office of Civil Rights. He said the Office of Marketing and Communications is addressing and helping update websites, software review and testing processes are being addressed, and other accessibility guidelines and resources are being made available. Executive Director of Marketing and Communications Thomas White provided more background and answered questions on website accessibility.

We believe this response constitutes full compliance with the ongoing requirement(s) listed above and defined in Section 1, Table 2 of the Corrective Action Plan Schedule.

3.1.3 - Table 3: Training Plan Ongoing Requirement(s):

Response:

Per University policy, everyone who creates and/or modifies online content is required to take Basic Web Accessibility training annually. As of March 12, 2019, a total of 1199 personnel have attended trainings across the 4 accessibility courses the University offers through TLT (Basic Web Accessibility; Accessible Office Documents; Accessible Documents in the LMS; Accessible PDFs). Follow up consultation is available through TLT (for instructional materials) and web accessibility liaisons (for all other web content).

Faculty and staff who are currently part of the software procurement process were invited to attend Basic Web Accessibility Training (see Addendum Section 3.3 – Training Attendees page 94 for a listing of those who attended) so that they understand the laws and standards related to web accessibility.

Reports regarding personnel trained were sent to OCR on March 14, 2017, December 31, 2017, and December 28, 2018 in accordance with OCR's timeline for reporting.

We believe this response constitutes full compliance with the ongoing requirement(s) listed above and defined in Section 1, Table 3 of the Corrective Action Plan Schedule.

3.2 - Web Accessibility

Response:

The official web registry is maintained by the Information & Communication Technology (ICT) Audit subcommittee and represents, to the best of our knowledge, all known domains and subdomains. To verify accessibility compliance, websites on the registry, that can be added and tracked by Siteimprove, are added to the University's instance of the Siteimprove Intelligence Platform. The number of websites tracked in Siteimprove decreased slightly between August of 2018 and February of 2019, from 190 domains to 183. This 4% decrease represents an effort to remove any domains that are no longer active. Additionally, as of March 2, 2019, Siteimprove is tracking and analyzing approximately 80.56% of websites that are in the web property registry. The remaining 19.44% of websites are either not compatible with Siteimprove's platform, not reachable from off-campus, or are not publicly available. Efforts to monitor and verify the remaining sites are in-progress.

We believe this response constitutes full compliance with the ongoing requirement(s) listed above and defined in Section 2, Table 4 of the Corrective Action Plan Schedule.

3.2.2 - Table 5: Content Management System Web Content (www.unr.edu) <u>Ongoing Requirement(s):</u>

Response:

As part of the redesign and rebuild of the University website (<u>www.unr.edu</u>), the Marketing & Communications Team, in partnership with colleges, divisions, and major units using the University's central Content Management System (CMS) has identified HTML content to carry forward in the new site build and developed a Launch Phase schedule to outline when certain types of content or sections will be migrated (see Addendum Section 2.0). Issues identified using automated accessibility tools such as the Siteimprove Intelligence Platform, the Level Access AMP application, as well as manual testing informed which types of content are brought into the new website. Lessons learned from remediating web accessibility issues identified both in and outside of the audit have, and continue to, influence both the design and development of the new website as well as any new templates, components or functionality. The new website makes accessibility a top priority, by incorporating the principals of Universal Design into both the visual and functional pieces of the site. The development, staging, and production sites are actively being tracked within the Siteimprove Platform, and manually checked by the Marketing & Communications Web Team, to ensure that all approved templates and pages are accessible before and after they go live in accordance with the University's ICT Accessibility Policy.

Additionally, The Marketing & Communications team continued to utilize Siteimprove to maintain an inventory of documents and media within the CMS. As of March 2, 2019, Siteimprove has identified 7,706 linked documents: 6,398 PDFs files, 732 Excel files, 490 Word files, 68 PowerPoints files. Of those 6,398 linked PDFs identified, Siteimprove has flagged 4,350 (68%) of the linked PDFs as inaccessible as of March 2, 2019. Activities and tasks related to removal and remediation of inaccessible documents are listed below (see Section 2.2.2. In-Progress Requirements related to Table 5: Content Management System).

The Marketing & Communications team also utilized Siteimprove to develop an inventory of all CMS-based embedded videos. As of March 2, 2019, Siteimprove has identified 271 videos that are embedded using either the YouTube (155), Vimeo (120), Wistia (0), or Kaltura (0) video

players. Some pages have multiple embeds. Web Accessibility Liaisons have access to a report within Siteimprove that can help them determine which videos need to be removed or remediated. Activities and tasks related to removal and remediation of inaccessible embedded multimedia within the CMS are listed above (see Section 2.2.2. In-Progress Requirements related to Table 5: Content Management System).

We believe this response constitutes full compliance with the ongoing requirement(s) listed above and defined in Section 2, Table 5 of the Corrective Action Plan Schedule.

Ongoing Requirement(s):

Response:

Web Accessibility Liaisons continued to update the Information and Communications Technology Audit subcommittee regarding any sites that need to be added to or removed from the official web registry. The number of websites tracked in Siteimprove decreased slightly between August of 2018 and February of 2019, from 190 domains to 183. This 4% decrease represents an effort to remove any domains that are no longer active.

Once current or new sites are analyzed by Siteimprove, Web Accessibility Liaisons are expected to use the information provided within Siteimprove to inform their decisions regarding either remediating or removing inaccessible content by the planned completion dates listed in the Corrective Action Plan Schedule.

The ICT Audit subcommittee also uses the information in Siteimprove to create Siteimprove Accessibility Reports for each of the colleges, divisions, and major units of the University. The Siteimprove Accessibility Reports lists each of the known domains and subdomains belonging to a college, division, or unit, as well as a count of the identified accessibility issues.

The MarCom team utilized Siteimprove to develop an inventory of documents and media outside of the CMS. As of March 2, 2019, Siteimprove has identified 38,765 linked documents: 33,790 PDF files, 425 Excel files, 2,850 Word files, 1,718 PowerPoint files. Of those 33,790 linked PDFs identified, Siteimprove has flagged 17,918 (53%) of the linked PDFs as inaccessible as of March 2, 2019. Activities and tasks related to removal and remediation of inaccessible documents outside the CMS are listed above (see Section 2.2.3. In-Progress Requirements related to Table 6: Non-Content Management System Web Content).

The MarCom team also utilized Siteimprove to develop an inventory of all embedded videos outside the CMS. As of March 2, 2019, Siteimprove has identified 1,636 videos that are embedded using either the YouTube (1,524), Vimeo (131), Wistia (1), or Kaltura (2) video

players. Some pages have multiple embeds. Web Accessibility Liaisons have access to a report within Siteimprove that can help them determine which videos need to be removed or remediated. Activities and tasks related to removal and remediation of inaccessible embedded multimedia within the CMS are listed above (see Section 2.2.3. In-Progress Requirements related to Table 6: Non-Content Management System) Web Content.

We believe this response constitutes full compliance with the ongoing requirement(s) listed above and defined in Section 2, Table 6 of the Corrective Action Plan Schedule.

Response:

All procedures for in-house captioning for instructional video content have been developed and implemented by TLT. Procedures for students to request captioning through the Disability Resource Center (DRC) remain in place and this information is communicated to all students registered through the DRC.

All instructional videos are captioned upon the request of the instructor or the DRC. Due the mercurial nature of instructional content, new video content is added daily, and instructors are responsible for ensuring their video materials are accessible.

We believe this response constitutes full compliance with the ongoing requirement(s) listed above and defined in Section 5, Table 11 of the Corrective Action Plan Schedule.

Web Accessibility Liaisons and domain owners are expected to use the information both in the report and in Siteimprove to inform their decisions regarding either remediating or removing inaccessible content by the planned completion dates listed in the Corrective Action Plan Schedule.

An "Accessibility Issues by Site" report was presented to the Provost on June 12, 2018, which summarized the state of accessibility compliance of each site at that time. Additional reports will be provided to the Provost on a quarterly basis.
